

Home Learning Week 15:

L.O: Today we are going to learn about celebrations and festivals we celebrate in Islam.

As you know, the two major festivals in Islam are Eid-ul-Fitr and Eid-ul-Adha. We observe Eid-ul-Fitr the 1st of Shawwal, the day after the month of Ramadan. This is the day muslims express their happiness and joy by offering Eid Salah and of visits their friends and family too.

Eid-ul-Adha is celebrated on the 10th of Dhul-Hijjah. It is on this day muslims remember Ibrahim (a)'s sacrifice of his son Ismail (a). This is particularly important for muslims and is commemorated every year during the days of Hajj. Muslims, if they can afford to do so, also sacrifice an animal on this day to seek Allah's pleasure and feed the poor and their neighbours.

Muslims also think of Jumu'ah Salah as a weekly festival as this is when they gather together for congregational or Ja'mah prayer.
