A Duty of the Young

Anas ibn Malik (may Allah be pleased with him) narrated that the Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) said, "*If a young man honors an elderly on account of his age, Allah appoints someone to honor him in his old age."* (At-Tirmidhi)

The Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) here advises the young of the Muslim society, who will be tomorrow's elderly, to honor the elderly. Continuous application of this Prophetic advice helps bridge the gap between generations and spreads an atmosphere of love and understanding between the young and the old. Consider here also the generalization in the Prophet's (peace and blessings be upon him) words: **"If a young man honors an elderly;**" the hadith requires honoring the elderly regardless of their color or religion.

In another hadith Muslims are told to be merciful to all people, Muslim and non-Muslim:

Anas ibn Malik (may Allah be pleased with him) narrated that the Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) said, "*By Him in Whose Power my soul is, Allah does not bestow His mercy except on a merciful one.* "They (the Companions) said, "*All of us are merciful.*" The Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) replied, "*Not only that each of you has mercy upon the other, but to have mercy also upon all people.*"
